HAMG 2330.501: CONVENTION AND MEETING PLANNING (3 credits; Spring 2024 – F2F)

Introduction to conventions, meetings and the trade show industry; emphasis on working relationships with associations, meeting planners and the travel and tourism industry. The role of convention services and the responsibilities for management.

HAMG 4324.001: DIVERSITY IN THE HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY (3 credits; Spring 2024 – F2F)

The course will explore diversity. Emphasis will be placed on the implications of operating a hospitality business and interactions among supervisors, employees, guests, and owners within the industry.

TRVM 4327.001: MEETINGS, EVENTS, EXPOSITIONS AND TECHNOLOGY (MEET) – (3 credits; Fall 2020; Hybrid - Livestream/Online; Fall 2021; 2nd 8-Week – F2F; Fall 2022-F2F; Fall 2023-F2F)

This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, events, expositions and event technology industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEET industry.

HUSC 5301.501: SERVICE MANAGEMENT IN HUMAN SCIENCES (3 credits; Spring 2021, 2022 2nd 8-Week; Spring 2023 2nd 8-Week; Spring 2024 2nd 8-Week; ONLINE)

Best practices in customer service in the human sciences, including real-life scenarios for putting exceptional customer service into practice and providing added value to the customer experience. Students in this course receive extensive course content information either in-class or via online content modules equivalent to 150 minutes per week for 15 weeks and includes a major final project. Students in the course will engage in a variety of assignments that can include, but are not limited to, significant course readings, course content exams, in-class or online discussions, academic research papers, and annotated bibliographies. For every hour a student spends engaging with the course content, they spend at least 2 hours completing associated activities and assessments.

HMSC 4326.002/HUSC 5326.501: FIELD EXPERIENCE IN HUMAN SCIENCES: WORLDWIDE EXPERIENCE AT THE INTERNATIONAL CANNES FILM FESTIVAL (3 credits; Maymester 2023)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities. This course was conducted during the Cannes Film Festival in Cannes, France.

HAMG 4380.001: EXECUTIVE STRATEGIES IN HOSPITALITY ADMINISTRATION (3 credits; Fall 2020; Livestream/Online; Fall 2021 – F2F; Fall 2022-F2F; Fall 2023-F2F)

Utilization of principles and components of the industry in effective administration. Coordination of resources in establishing policy, supervision and management, and decision making in the delivery of hospitality services. (Course Fee: \$50)

HAMG 4324.001: DIVERSITY IN THE HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY (HMS 485) (3 credits; Spring 2021; F2F/Livestream; Spring 2022 – F2F; Spring 2023 – F2F; Spring 2024 – F2F)

The course will explore diversity. Emphasis will be placed on the implications of operating a hospitality business and interactions among supervisors, employees, guests, and owners within the industry.

HAMG 3280.050: ADVANCED LODGING OPERATIONS PRACTICUM (2 credits; Spring 2021, 2022; F2F)

Senior management techniques required to operate a lodging facility applying strategic and critical thinking and work-site experiences in the management of rooms, guests, services, sales, financial issues, security and personnel. This course is taken concurrently with HAMG 3180.640.

NOTE: It is recommended that Hospitality Administration students take this course after taking HAMG 1313: Principles of Lodging.

HAMG 3180.640: ADVANCED LODGING OPERATIONS (1 credit; Spring 2021; Hybrid – Livestream/Online; Spring 2022 – F2F)

Senior management techniques required to operate a lodging facility applying strategic and critical thinking and work-site experiences in the management of rooms, guests, services, sales, financial issues, security and personnel. This course is taken concurrently with HAMG 3280 050P (HMS 380P).

NOTE: It is recommended that Hospitality Administration students take this course after taking HAMG 1313: Principles of Lodging.

HAMG 2337.501/502: HOSPITALITY FACILITY MANAGEMENT (3 credits; Fall 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023; Spring 2021, 2022, 2023; ONLINE)

Overview of elements of design, building systems, construction techniques and space utilization in relation to safety and efficiency of service. Site location, energy conservation, fire protection, maintenance and upkeep as factors influencing retail, dining service and lodging accommodations.

HAMG 2313.501: PRINCIPLES OF LODGING (3 credits; Summer 2023; Fall 2023; ONLINE)

Focus on the principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations, guest expectations, food, beverage, and maintenance services, promotions, budget control, personnel and security.

HAMG 1313.501: PRINCIPLES OF LODGING (3 credits; Fall 2020, 2021, 2022; Summer 2022, 2023; ONLINE)

Focus on the principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations, guest expectations, food, beverage, and maintenance services, promotions, budget control, personnel and security.

HAMG 1313.301: PRINCIPLES OF LODGING (3 credits; Fall 2020, 2021, 2022; ONLINE)

Focus on the principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations, guest expectations, food, beverage, and maintenance services, promotions, budget control, personnel and security.

HMS 589.001: Thesis Research (3 credits; Fall 2017)

This course is designed to be taken by thesis-bound graduate students in the School of Human Sciences, prior to the thesis writing course (HMS 590). During the course, students will form their thesis committee, design the thesis project, develop the literature review and methodology sections of the thesis, and complete various other steps toward the goal of completing the thesis. The thesis will be used for assessment purposes for the School of Human Sciences.

HMS 575.002: Advanced Graduate Studies (3 credits; Summer II 2018)

Individual instruction. Prerequisite: School approval. (One to three credit hours).

HMS 501.501: SERVICE MANAGEMENT IN HUMAN SCIENCES (3 credits; Summer II 2020; ONLINE)

Best practices in customer service in the human sciences, including real-life scenarios for putting exceptional customer service into practice and providing added value to the customer experience. Students in this course receive extensive course content information either in-class or via online content modules equivalent to 150 minutes per week for 15 weeks and includes a major final project. Students in the course will engage in a variety of assignments that can include, but are not limited to, significant course readings, course content exams, in-class or online discussions, academic research papers, and annotated bibliographies. For every hour a student spends engaging with the course content, they spend at least 2 hours completing associated activities and assessments.

HMS 485.001: Management of the Diverse Hospitality Workforce (3 credits; Spring 2019)

The course will explore diversity. Emphasis will be placed on the implications of operating a hospitality business and interactions among supervisors, employees, guests, and owners within the industry.

HMS 485.001: Managing a Diverse Workforce (3 credits; Spring 2018; Spring 2016, 2017)

The course will explore the legal implications of operating a hospitality business with emphasis on the human resource interaction among supervisors, employees, guests, and owners. Additional materials will be used to present methodologies for recruitment, selection, orientation, training, disciplining, and discharging employees.

HMS 480.001: Hospitality Administration (3 credits; Fall 2019; Fall 2018; Fall 2017; Fall 2016; Fall 2015)

Utilization of principles and components of the industry in effective administration. Coordination of resources in establishing policy, supervision and management, and decision making in the delivery of hospitality services.

HMS 478.002: Special Topic: Special Events Production (3 credits; Spring 2018)

In-depth study of selected topics within the discipline of human sciences. The management and operation of events, design, marketing, and promotion efforts. Identifying sponsors, marketing to attendees, exhibitors, and other participants. Prerequisite: school approval.

HMS 478.001: Special Topic: Meetings, Events, Expositions & Technology (3 credits; Fall 2017)

In-depth study of selected topics within the discipline of human sciences. This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, events, expositions and event technology industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEET industry. In addition, this course will include topics that will prepare the students to be successful in getting their Meeting and Event Technology Certification. This certificate program has been developed for students who are currently practicing or anticipating careers in meeting or event management. The certificate is designed to provide both training and education in meeting and event technology, as well as meeting planning. Prerequisite: school approval.

HMS 475.001: Special Problems (3 credits; Summer II 2018; Summer II 2017)

Individual instruction. Prerequisite: school approval. (One to three credit hours).

HMS 472.001: Special Events Production (3 credits; Spring 2019)

The management and operation of events, design, marketing, and promotion efforts. Identifying sponsors, marketing to attendees, exhibitors, and other participants

HMS 470.601: Meetings, Events, Expositions & Technology (MEET) (3 credits; Fall 2019; Fall 2018)

This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, events, expositions and event technology industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEET industry.

HMS 426.001: Field Experiences in Human Sciences: Worldwide Experience at the Cannes Film Festival (3 credits; Maymester 2018; Maymester 2017)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities. This course was conducted during the Cannes Film Festival in Cannes, France.

HMS 426.001: Field Experiences in Human Sciences (3 credits; Fall 2016; Spring 2016; Fall 2015)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities.

HMS 426.001: Field Experiences in Human Sciences (Special Event Production; 3 credits; Spring 2016)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities.

HMS 380.001: Lodging II (3 credits; Spring 2018; Spring 2017; Spring 2016)

Emphasis on principles of lodging management in the workplace. Classroom instruction and work site experiences in the management of guests, services, sales, financial management, security and personnel. The comprehension and construction of a profit and loss statement is a critical assessment of this course.

HMS 332.501: Communicating Human Sciences Content (3 credits; Fall 2019; Fall 2018; Fall 2017; Summer II 2016; Summer II 2017; ONLINE)

Rationale, design delivery and evaluation of professional presentations for diverse audiences, instructional interaction, and product promotion.

HMS 322.501: Facility Planning/Management (3 credits; Spring 2019; Summer II 2018; Spring 2018; Spring 2017; Fall 2016; ONLINE)

Overview of elements of design, building systems, construction techniques and space utilization in relation to safety and efficiency of service. Site location, energy conservation, fire protection, maintenance and upkeep as factors influencing retail, dining service and lodging accommodations. Prerequisite: Junior Standing.

HMS 302.001: Introduction to Lodging (3 credits; Fall 2019; Fall 2018)

Focus on the principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations, guest expectations, food, beverage, and maintenance services, promotions, budget control, personnel and security.

HMS 302.001: Lodging 1 (3 credits; Fall 2017)

Principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations; guest expectations; food, beverage and maintenance services; promotions; budget control; personnel; and security. Prerequisites: HMS 102; Junior standing or school approval.

HMS 302.301: Lodging 1 (3 credits; Fall 2018; ONLINE)

Principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations; guest expectations; food, beverage and maintenance services; promotions; budget control; personnel; and security. Prerequisites: HMS 102; Junior standing or school approval.

HMS 302.501: Lodging 1 (3 credits; Fall 2016; Summer II 2016; Fall 2015; ONLINE)

Principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations; guest expectations; food, beverage and maintenance services; promotions; budget control; personnel; and security. Prerequisites: HMS 102; Junior standing or school approval.

HMS 220.501: CONVENTION AND MEETING PLANNING (3 credits; Summer 2020; ONLINE)

Introduction to conventions, meetings and the trade show industry; emphasis on working relationships with associations, meeting planners and the travel and tourism industry. The role of convention services and the responsibilities for management.

HMS 102: Introduction to Hospitality Industry (3 credits; Summer II 2015; Online)

Overview of the vast scope of the industry, historical perspective, analysis of the industry as a profession, professional opportunities and future outlook.

HRTM 495: Hospitality Management Study Tour (1-6 hours; Fall 2013)

Broadening perspective and developing an understanding of the hospitality industry through visits. Tours to hospitality facilities, national food and equipment shows; food processors; equipment manufacturers; and trade exchanges.

HRTM 496/896: Independent Study (1-6 hours; Fall 2013, Fall 2014) – Graduate Course

Requires a contract with an individual HRTM faculty member. Letter grade only. Individual projects in research, literature review, and/or creative activity.

HRTM 396: Independent Study (1-6 hours; Spring 2013, Fall 2013, Summer 2014)

Requires a contract with an individual HRTM faculty member. Letter grade only. Individual projects in research, literature review, and/or creative activity.

HRTM 489/889: Advanced Event Operations (Spring 2011, 2012 (2 sections), 2013, 2014, 2015; Fall 2013) – Graduate Course

The management and operation of events, design, marketing, and promotion efforts. Identifying, sponsors, marketing to attendees, exhibitors, and other participants. Pre-reqs: HRTM 289.

HRTM 485/885: Advanced Lodging Operations (Spring 2011, 2012)

Senior management techniques required to operate a lodging facility applying strategic and critical thinking with case study analysis to solve problems. Requires field trips to local lodging facilities. Pre-reqs: HRTM 285 – Graduate Course

HRTM 285: Introduction to the Lodging Industry (Fall 2010, 2011; Summer 2014)

Fundamentals of the lodging industry including characteristics and management of hotel/motel/resort properties through basic understanding of accounting, housekeeping, engineering, front desk, and guest services.

HRTM 289: Introduction to the Event Industry (Fall 2010, 2011, 2013; Spring 2013, 2014, 2015; Summer 2014)

This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, conventions, events, and exposition industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEEC industry.

HRTM 109: Travel and Tourism (Fall 2007, 2008)

Survey of travel and tourism; focus on concepts, terminology, demographics, financial significance and trends.

HRTM 204: Facility Management (Spring 2008, 2009, 2010; Fall 2009)

Fundamentals of the role, cost, design, maintenance and management of hospitality and health care facilities. Emphasis on the concept and interface of building systems, trends, sustainability, safety, wastewater, electrical, illumination, food service equipment, heating, ventilation and air conditioning. SFA announces recipients of 2023 Center for Applied Research and Rural Innovation grants. NACOGDOCHES, Texas – Stephen F. Austin State University has announced the 2023 recipients of grants issued through its Center for Applied Research and Rural Innovation.

The center's steering committee selected nine proposals with awards totaling more than \$280,000. Now in its second year, the CARRI grant program is part of SFA's effort to support innovation and entrepreneurship in the university's 12-county coverage region.

"The faculty research grants provide an opportunity for faculty and students to engage with the local community in a variety of ways," said Mary Ann Rojas, CARRI's executive director. "The applications were selected through a competitive process, and each applicant demonstrated economic impact, measurable outcomes and student engagement."

The 2023 grant recipients and their research are as follows:

Dr. David Kulhavy – Forestry and Spatial Science, Arthur Temple College of Forestry and Agriculture - \$19,490

Meeting the Demands of Unmanned Aerial Systems and Use in East Texas

The use of unmanned aerial systems, also known as drones, is increasing in society with over 100,000 drone pilots needed in the \$63.5 billion marketplace by 2025. Funds will go toward a workshop on emergency management and campus maintenance with area agencies that will promote current uses, training and technology. It will focus on the DJI Phantom 4 Pro, DJI Phantom RTK Multispectral, DJI Dual Enterprise Thermal and the new Quantum-Systems vertical takeoff drone.

Dr. Jared Barnes – Department of Agriculture, College of Forestry and Agriculture - \$32,964

A Sustainable Plant Trial Garden for the Plantery Student Botanic Garden

Diversity among and within plants is a cornerstone of horticulture. However, with great diversity comes the need for stakeholders to know how plants are going to perform in a region for sustainable planting decisions. The Plantery is the student botanic garden on campus, and we wish to build a trial garden for evaluating plant material for East Texas. Permanent, modern infrastructure will be installed to make the trial garden attractive and functional.

Amanda Breitbach – School of Art, Micky Elliott College of Fine Arts - \$16,400

Tourism and Education, The Cole Art Center @ The Old Opera House

The Cole Art Center is an important source of culture and community in East Texas and a valuable economic engine for downtown Nacogdoches. It is also at the heart of transformational experiences for School of Art students, who learn practical skills while working there. Project funds will be used to develop a new student docent program, pay student workers, fund a graduate assistantship for an events planner, establish local and regional partnerships through First Friday events, and assess the economic impact of the arts in Nacogdoches.

Dr. Mikhail Kouliavtsev – Department of Economics and Finance, Nelson Rusche College of Business - \$23,660

Economic Contribution of CARRI

The goal of this project is to establish and maintain a set of metrics enabling the Center for Applied Research and Rural Innovation staff members to measure the economic contribution of the center's activities to the region. Data collected from various government agencies as well as local sources will be compiled into a dashboard, which can subsequently be used to assess and measure the benefits of CARRI and its impact on the local area. Support for undergraduate students will ensure that they can provide services as interns to smaller communities where local officials may not be able to afford a paid intern.

Dr. Bill Forbes – Department of Anthropology, Geography and Sociology; College of Liberal and Applied Arts - \$20,860

Solar Weatherization Business, Workforce and Student Support

Sustainability students used a matching CARRI grant in 2022 to conduct energy program outreach in deep East Texas. They built contacts and collected information related to renewable energy incentives, low-income weatherization programs and potential partners. This proposal continues that work by offering support for potential businesses and workforce members interested in apprenticeships and training, and for a graduate student who gathered the most valuable information on weatherization workforce training last year.

Dr. Jane Long – Department of Mathematics and Statistics, College of Sciences and Mathematics - \$39,142

Laboratory Science Enrichment for Secondary Teachers

A thriving deep East Texas requires a workforce of highly trained science, technology, engineering and mathematics professionals. Investment in teachers is a well-documented best practice for improving student academic achievement and increasing student engagement in STEM fields. This project focuses on enhancing student interest in STEM subjects through weeklong workshops that train secondary public-school teachers to incorporate engaging, inquiry-based, hands-on laboratory experiences in their science classrooms.

Dr. Kefa Onchoke – Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, College of Sciences and Mathematics - \$21,050

Studies of Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Sulfonate Pollutants in Biosolids

Biosolids, also known as wastewater sludge, are produced by wastewater treatment plants. They are complex and contain organic matter, plant macro/micronutrients, trace and heavy metals, and emerging pollutants, including pesticides, pharmaceuticals in trace levels and per- and polyfluoroalkyl sulfonates, or PFAS. This study will analyze PFAS concentrations in biosolids and wastewater samples from the Nacogdoches Wastewater Treatment Plant via ultra-high-performance liquid chromatography-quadrupole mass spectrometry and gas chromatography.

Dr. Gina Fe Causin – School of Human Sciences, James I. Perkins College of Education - \$22,724

Convening the Deep East Texas Forest Country Tourism Collective

In May 2022, chambers of commerce and convention and visitors' bureaus from 12 deep East Texas counties, the Deep East Texas Council of Governments, cities, tourism centers, the Texas Travel Alliance, Texas Economic Development and the Texas Forest Trail convened to form the Deep East Texas Forest Country Tourism Collective. They created unique travel and tourism experiences that could fuel economic activities across their boundaries. Representatives discovered other issues and gaps to address to enhance and stabilize the economic development in the area. This proposal will assist in continuing the collective's work.

Sally Ann Swearingen – School of Human Sciences, Perkins College of Education - \$86,918

Building Communities One Building at a Time with Construction Jacks

The purpose of this project is to bring agencies, community and manufacturers together to assist with people who are homeless. This proposal contains two goals. The first is to build tiny homes for individuals and families in need of shelter with the help of construction management and interior design students to design, build and furnish the homes. The second is to bring community companies, such as lumber mills, nonprofit organizations, showrooms and federal agencies, together to assist with partial funding of the homes.
